Our Mission Field

Red Deer is Alberta's third most populous city—after Calgary and Edmonton. Welcome to the aspen parkland of Alberta; a region of rolling hills focused on oil, grain, and cattle production. The city is a centre for oil and agriculture distribution.

The Cree peoples called the river on which Red Deer now stands, Waskasoo Seepee. This can be translated "Wapiti River" or "Elk River". Some of the first British traders thought the wapiti were a type of European red deer and gave the river its current name.

The population of the City of Red Deer according to its 2009 municipal census is 89,891 Over 26% of the City said they had no religious affiliation.
